Restoring Catholic Culture

A brief look at what it is like when the world is Catholic

THE ADVENT WREATH

While the exact origin of the Advent Wreath is uncertain, some of the customs may be traced to Germanic & Scandinavian peoples who lit wreaths of candles during cold December days as a sign of hope in the coming spring. The ring represented the earth turning back toward the sun which lengthened the days and returned the life-giving warmth. It is not difficult to see why medieval Christians adopted this custom and applied the symbol to Christ, awaited by all the world as "the true light, which enlighteneth every man that cometh into the world" (Jn. 1:9). Christ is awaited liturgically through Advent and again at Christmas "is come into the world." (Jn. 3:19).

The wreath of evergreens symbolizes continuous life. The laurel is the classical symbol of victory or it may as well recall the crown of thorns. The circle of the wreath without beginning or end can further be said to symbolize the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and eternal life. Pine cones and other seeds also represent immortality or the seed of eternal life. A candle for each of the four weeks of Advent represents each one a century for the four thousand years man awaited the Saviour of the world. Candles represent prayer: Three are violet for penance. The rose colored candle is for joy and corresponds with Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday, the midpoint of Advent and the eager and renewed hope in the coming Christ Child.

Although the Advent wreath is not, strictly speaking, liturgical, centuries of custom have provided a place for the wreath among the devotions of the Catholic Faith. Each week of Advent, a prayer and ceremony for the lighting of the Advent Wreath will be given in the bulletin. The following is a ceremony for the Advent wreath that could be used in the home during the First Week of Advent:

In the home, at dinnertime of the first Sunday of Advent following the meal blessing, the father of the house prays:

O God, by whose word all things are sanctified, pour forth Thy blessing upon this wreath, and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive from Thee abundant graces. Who livest and reignest forever. Amen.

Then, each day of the week he prays:

O Lord, stir up Thy might, we beg thee, and come, that by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by Thy deliverance. Who livest and reignest forever.

The youngest child then lights the first candle.

I would like to encourage you to do your part to "restore Catholic Culture" and live your everyday life more according to the mind of the Catholic Church. For the next four weeks, we continue in the season of preparation for Christmas called Advent. It is a time when we prepare our hearts to receive our Infant King Who is to come. Christmas does not begin until the night of the 24th. It is true that many people do not have the luxury of waiting until Christmas Eve to decorate, put up the tree, etc. although I encourage you to do so if you are able. However, it would be a good witness to our Faith and Catholic Tradition to wait until then to turn on Christmas lights, wish each other Merry Christmas and otherwise celebrate. Then, as the Catholic Church is so good about doing (i.e. feasting well), we extend the festivity the entire 12 Days of Christmas (Day 1 is December 25 and Day 12 is Epiphany Eve) and even through the whole Christmas season, which, on the Traditional calendar, continues through February 2nd, Candlemas.

Please remember that the weekday Mass on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays is now said at 8 a.m. beginning this week.
