Announcements

All Saints Day is this Tuesday, November 1st. It is a Holyday of Obligation which means that all Catholics who have the use of reason are bound under pain of mortal sin to attend Mass and abstain from unnecessary manual labor on that day. To help everyone fulfil his obligation, as well as to give glory to God through His saints, two Masses will be offered at St. Stanislaus: a Low Mass at 7 a.m. and a High Mass at 7 p.m. The parish office will always be closed on Holydays of Obligation and a collection will be taken on these days as well. (There will be no 12 Noon Low Mass on this day).

All Souls Day is Wednesday, November 2nd. On this day, every priest has the privilege of offering three Requiem Masses. One of these Masses must be offered for All the Faithful Departed, another for the Intentions of the Holy Father and the third may be offered for any intention. Here at St. Stanislaus. Father Brancich will offer the 7 p.m. Requiem High Mass for all the intentions that you submit. Write down the names of any deceased that you would like to have included in this Mass and put the names in the box in the back of Church by the end of today (Sunday). Please do not include any money as Father can only keep a total of \$10 for all the combined intentions and he is happy to offer the Mass for all the intentions all of you submit. The other two Masses will be Low Masses offered at 7 a.m. (offered for All the Faithful Departed) and 8 a.m. (offered for the Intentions of the Holy Father). The 7 p.m. High Mass will be followed by the Absolution at the Catafalque which is a "fake casket" representing whichever Faithful Departed are being prayed for at the Mass.

During the month of the Holy Souls in Purgatory, we have a great opportunity and even an obligation to help those who have died in the state of Sanctifying Grace but with either unforgiven Venial Sins or unfulfilled temporal punishment due to sin. These are the Souls in Purgatory, undergoing a purgation/cleansing so that they can eventually enter Heaven. These souls can do nothing to help themselves, but we can. We can offer prayers, our own sufferings and Holy Masses and earn indulgences for them which will help to shorten their purgation so they can more quickly enter Heaven. On each day from November 1 through November 8, a **Plenary Indulgence**, applicable only to the Poor Souls, can be earned by those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. Only one Plenary Indulgence can be earned each day and the "usual conditions" must also be fulfilled:

- 1. Confession (within one week before or after and one confession can be applied for several indulgences)
- 2. Holy Communion received, preferably on the day the Indulgence is earned
- 3. Prayers for the Traditional and holy "Intentions of the Holy Father"
- 4. Freedom from attachment to all sin, even venial If any of the requirements for a Plenary Indulgence are not fulfilled, a Partial Indulgence is granted, and several

of these can be earned each day. Other **Partial Indulgences** that can be earned for the Poor Souls include:

- Reciting Lauds (Morning Prayer) or Vespers (Evening Prayer) of the Dead
- 2. Reciting the prayer "Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domine, et lux perpetua luceat eis. Requiescant in pace. Amen." (Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. Many they rest in peace. Amen."

One more request for all who intend to attend St. Stanislaus regularly or occasionally to register either online through our website or with the paper forms in the back of Church. If you will be remaining registered at another parish, please inform us so that we list you as an Associate here.

Today is the Feast of Christ the King on our Traditional calendar. One may gain a plenary indulgence by publicly reciting the Act of Consecration of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Reciting this Act along with the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament Exposed is to be done in all parish Churches and so we will do this at the end of Mass today.
