From Your Pastor

There is quite a bit of variety on the Church calendar in the upcoming weeks. Today is "World Mission Sunday" in which the Church calls upon us to take care of the poor both spiritually and physically. Normally, there is a collection taken up on this day for the Society of the Propagation of the Faith (formerly headed by Archbishop Fulton Sheen) which provides funding for the missionary activities of the Church. The Diocese is giving us a little start-up time for our new parish and so the mandatory second collections will not begin for us until January 1st.

Tuesday of this week is the Feast of St. Isidore the Farmer, a feast proper to the United States. As this growing season comes to an end, made especially difficult this year

Announcements

All Saints Day is Tuesday, November 1st. It is a Holyday of Obligation which means that all Catholics who have the use of reason are bound under pain of mortal sin to attend Mass and abstain from unnecessary manual labor on that day. To help everyone fulfil his obligation, as well as to give glory to God through His saints, two Masses will be offered at St. Stanislaus: a Low Mass at 7 a.m. and a High Mass at 7 p.m. The parish office will always be closed on Holydays of Obligation and a collection will be taken on these days as well.

All Souls Day is Wednesday, November 2nd. On this day, every priest has the privilege of offering three Requiem Masses. One of these Masses must be offered for All the Faithful Departed, another for the Intentions of the Holy Father and the third may be offered for any intention. Here at St. Stanislaus, Father Brancich will offer the 7 p.m. Requiem High Mass for all the intentions that you submit. Write down the names of any deceased that you would like to have included in this Mass and put the names in the box in the back of Church. Please do not include any money as Father can only keep a total of \$10 for all the combined intentions and he is happy to offer the Mass for all the intentions all of you submit. The other two Masses will be Low Masses offered at 7 a.m. and 8 a.m. The 7 p.m. High Mass will be followed by the Absolution at the Catafalque which is a "fake casket" representing whichever Faithful Departed are being prayed for at the Mass.

November is dedicated to the Holy Souls and one of the most powerful gifts that can be given to a departed soul is to have a Mass offered for him. On all 3rd or 4th Class weekdays from November 3rd through 8th the Daily Mass for the Dead can be offered. Those who would like to have an individual Mass offered on these days or other days in November for particular souls are asked to submit their Mass Intention Request envelopes today if at all possible. This is separate from the Nov. 2 Mass.

Registrations of individuals and families are now being accepted by paper form and online for St. Stanislaus Parish. Please register if you intend to attend regularly or occasionally. If you will be remaining registered at another parish, please inform us so that we list you as an Associate here.

A list of weekly and monthly cleaning tasks in the Church has been posted on a clipboard in the Servers' Sacristy. Anyone who has any amount of time during the week is invited to stop by the Church and complete one or more of the tasks which range from simple vacuuming to sanctuary, restroom and main Church cleaning. If you are able to help, please contact the rectory and we will forward your name on to the parishioner who has volunteered to help coordinate this effort.

Assistance is needed in winterizing the rectory and Church, mainly removing and storing the window A/C units in the rectory and the floor fans in the Church. If you are able to assist, please contact the office.

with droughts, floods and tornadoes, let us remember in our prayers the farmers of our country who struggle day to day to grow the food that we often take for granted.

Next Sunday is the Feast of Christ the King on our Traditional calendar. One may gain a plenary indulgence by publicly reciting the Act of Consecration of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Reciting this Act along with the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament Exposed is to be done in all parish Churches and so we will do this at the end of Mass next Sunday.

Today after Mass there will be an enrollment ceremony for anyone who joined the Confraternity of St. Peter in the past year. I realize that our parish is new and perhaps not much is known about the Confraternity, which is a spiritual group of laymen who wish to unite more closely to the work of the Fraternity of St. Peter. At our Fall priest meeting in Nebraska last week, we priests discussed the fact that our local chapters of the Confraternity are underpublicized and under-used. We agreed that efforts need to be made to make the work of the Confraternity more known and the process of enrollment needs to be simplified. Stay tuned for improvements in these areas in the coming months. Perhaps you will be among those going through the ceremony next year around this time.

I am considering changing the Monday, Wednesday and Friday Mass time from 7 a.m. to 8 a.m. based on the attendance and feedback from several of you. I would welcome other comments on this potential change — would you be more or less likely to come to Mass on these days with the change? It was set at 7 a.m. based on survey feedback I received from about 100 of you in August, but it seems like the time is not working for many after all. Please let me know your opinion.
